Internet browsing/searching

- Browsers
 - o Google Chrome – Very customizable, login creates transferability between machines
 - o Mozilla Firefox – Open source, more privacy oriented
 - o Microsoft Edge – Windows default
 - o Safari - Apple/iOS/Mac default
 - o DDG – mobiles
- Search Engines
 - o Google
 - o DuckDuckGo
 - o Bing

- Slides – presentations, images

Exploration

- In document, type a few notes about what you found. Copy and paste the web address in case you want to get back to it later
- Create a new presentation in desired presentation format
 - o Insert text and a picture about your previous search topic (copy and paste)
- If you have time, open numbers program and create a basic spreadsheet
 - o Holiday names and dates
 - o Family names and birthdays
 - o Grocery items and how many to get
 - o Holiday shopping budget (names, ideas, cost thoughts)
- Explore search engines or browsing – what are stumbling blocks, what do you find interesting?
- What other questions do you have, other needs would you like to learn to meet?
- Bonus ideas:
 - o Library programs – databases, Libby, Hoopla
 - o Canva
 - o Picture management
